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### **1. INTRODUCTION**

SOS Children's Village Ijevan is focused on enhancing the well-being of children and young people without parental care or at risk of losing it. As a result of cooperation with partner organizations, it becomes possible to create a safe environment for children and young people in difficult life situations, where they can freely express their emotions, feelings and discover their potential. One of this cooperation is the «Art therapy for vulnerable children in Ijevan» project which is financially supported by SOAR-Armenia for a duration of one year, from February 5, 2024, to January 31, 2025. The project goal is «Assist in social inclusion of vulnerable children through art therapy».

Art therapy project is important for children faced many difficulties in their life because the creative activities give them a safe way to share their thoughts and experiences, which helps them process difficult emotions, reduce stress, and improve self-esteem and awareness. This type of therapy not only promotes healing but also helps children build confidence and social skills.

After the summer vacation in July, the children with great enthusiasm resumed the following courses organized within the framework of the project

- Art and Craft workshop.
- Stained-glass workshop.

# 2. PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION

#### 2.1. Project description

During the reporting period (6 Aug 2024 – 5 Nov 2024), the Stained Glass and Art and craft workshops' classes continued to be held twice a week, 1 hour per class. The Art and Craft classes took place on Tuesdays and Thursdays, and the Stained-glass classes on Wednesdays and Fridays. In October, the schedule for the Stained-glass classes was changed and the classes were organized on Wednesday and Thursday, considering the participation of children in other hobby groups and extracurricular activities. The psychologist and the workshop specialists continued to collaborate on the ongoing activities.

In the reporting quarter, during the Art and craft classes the children began making gypsum figures alongside their painting and handicraft projects. They excitedly mixed water with gypsum and quickly poured it into special containers or silicone molds. The little ones could hardly wait for the figures to dry so they could paint them. They plan to use the figures as Christmas decorations. For the events dedicated to Golden Autumn, the children, working in small groups, enthusiastically prepared large posters, which they took to school and presented to their classes.









The children also enthusiastically participated in making 3D pictures with plasticine, which helped them develop their motor skills and improve their focus.

During the 3 months of the reporting quarter, the children created many handicrafts and pictures, which are listed in Table 1:

During the Stained-Glass classes, in addition to depicting their favorite football players, flowers, and nature scenes, the children enthusiastically began creating Tiffany-style toys and souvenirs. They were very excited to paint on small pieces of glass with metal edges, which they used to make beautiful art-works. The workshop gave children the opportunity to work together with friends, sharing ideas and offering help on challenging tasks. Since October, the children have begun creatively painting Armenian ornaments on glass. They are using vibrant colors and incorporating themes inspired by Artsakh to add cultural significance to their artwork.









During the 3 months of the reporting quarter, the children created many pictures on glass, which are listed in Table 2:

## 2.2. Project beneficiaries

During the reporting period, 48 participants attended the workshop classes, exceeding the planned number of 30:

- 34 children from the village;
- 14 children from the community.

Children from the community attend the Day Care Centre at Children's Village Ijevan, which provides multidisciplinary support to children from families facing challenging life circumstances. Their participation in these classes is important for the social integration of children. SOS Armenia continues to cover the additional material costs for the workshops, caused by the increasing number of participants.

Below please find the number and age group of children in each workshop.

Some children from the village participate enthusiastically in both classes, enjoying creative activities and the opportunity to spend time with friends.





#### 2.3. Success story

Tatyana participates enthusiastically in Stained-glass classes and also attends the Art and Craft group in her spare time. On Fridays, besides Stained-glass, she attends dance classes at Art School. During concert preparations, when her dance teacher held longer sessions, Tatyana would sometimes come late to Stained-glass and felt very disappointed. Noticing this, her teacher offered to let her stay longer to work, but Tatyana liked the group atmosphere and the chance to make pictures on glass with her friends.

The workshop specialist suggested that the group choose a different day to accommodate her schedule. The children decided to hold one of the classes on Thursdays. When Tatyana came, they happily told her, «Tatyana, we changed the day for you so we can work together longer! » She was thrilled to have such wonderful friends to create beautiful works of art with.
